Statutory Declaration

Authorised Witnesses

In accordance with the *Oaths Act 1900*, any of the following persons may witness the signing of a statutory declaration within New South Wales:

- the Registrar-General
- a Deputy Registrar-General
- a Justice of the Peace
- a notary public
- a commissioner of the court for taking affidavits
- an Australian legal practitioner authorised by section 27 (1) of the Oaths Act 1900 to take and receive any affidavit
- any other person by law authorised to administer an oath.

WARNING
